
In a culture where litter is ignored or dismissed, picking it up can be viewed as a counter cultural act.

Election results

A by election on Thursday for the Great Paxton ward at Huntingdonshire District Council was won by the Liberal Democrat James Catmur in a seat held previously by the Conservatives. The result, a swing of around 10% from Conservatives to Lib Democrats, will have little impact on control of the Council which is run by a cross-party alliance of Independents, Liberal Democrats, Labour, and Greens. Liberal Democrats now have 12 seats on the council, HDC Independent Group 15, Labour 4, Green 1, and Conservatives 20. Meanwhile Conservative, Darryl Preston, retained his Police and Crime Commissioner role as a swing of 6.5% to Labour was insufficient for their candidate, Anna Smith, to take control.
